

**Subject:** Meeting of the 14<sup>th</sup> Project Sanctioning Committee (PSC) on UJJAWALA- A Comprehensive Scheme for Prevention of Trafficking and Rescue, Rehabilitation and Reintegration of Victims of Trafficking for Commercial Sexual Exploitation, on 15.2.2012.

A meeting of the PSC for 'UJJAWALA'- A Comprehensive Scheme for Prevention of Trafficking and Rescue, Rehabilitation and Reintegration of Victims of Trafficking for Commercial Sexual Exploitation was held on 15.2.2012 at 11.00 A.M. in Room No.601, A-Wing, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi. The PSC considered the proposals received from the Non-Governmental Organizations, duly recommended by the State Governments. A list of participants is enclosed at **Annex-I**.

2. In all, 35 proposals from 10 States of Assam, Chhattisgarh, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Odisha, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh and Nagaland were considered by the PSC. Of these 7 proposals from Karnataka, Maharashtra and Odisha were review proposals as they had completed 3 years of implementation. Out of the 35 proposals, the Committee approved 27 proposals, deferred 1 proposal and rejected 7 proposals as per details given below:


3. The list of proposals approved/deferred/rejected by the PSC is given below at **Annex- II**. In respect of proposals approved, the amount sanctioned will be as per the schematic norms. However, for the organisations that have been given approval for Rehabilitation (Protective and Rehabilitative Homes) component, the number of victims for which the approval is given is also indicated in the **last column**. Where the Home is sanctioned for 25 inmates, the admissible budget is attached at **Annex- III**. In case of the continuation of the project in **fourth year**, for



the component 'Prevention' grant for Formulation and functioning of Community Vigilance Group and Formulation and functioning of Balika (adolescent girls)/ Balala (adolescent children) Sanghas will be given in full and for the remaining items of prevention it will be 50% of the schematic norms.

4. The following general decisions were taken in the meeting:-

- Representative of Ministry of Home Affairs will be coopted as a Member of PSC.
- State Governments should do inspection of the P & R Home under Ujjawala to ensure the comfort level of facility provided to the victims. Ministry of Women and Child Development will also do inspection periodically.
- Under the 'Prevention' component, the NGO should sensitize the community about the benefits available under the various schemes of Central and State Government especially those pertaining to economic empowerment / livelihood opportunities and facilitate the accessibility of such schemes through linkage with related Departments in the State.
- Wherever 'Rehabilitation' component is sanctioned, the States should facilitate and ensure that the necessary license under Section 21 of the Immoral Traffic Prevention Act, 1956 is obtained by the NGO.
- The Ministry of Women and Child Development will devise a proforma for getting detailed information from the State Government/ UTs for continuation of the project in the fourth year with outcome related indicators.
- The Ministry will work towards online monitoring of the project under Ujjawala Scheme through the Result Framework Document.
- The State Governments/ UTs would be advised to work toward an integrated Plan of Action with structured meetings with the police, Anti Human Trafficking Units, concentrating on poverty alleviation programmes, training/capacity building of the implementers of projects on trafficking, as the Government of Karnataka had reported to be doing.
- Every State Government/ UT would be advised to document the best practices of implementing Ujjawala.
